Consortium's focus on collaboration in 2006 provides positive results

Teamwork makes it happen!

One of the goals that members of the Consortium staff made a year ago was to expand collaborative efforts in order to provide more comprehensive services to Delawareans living with HIV/AIDS.

2006 was a year of collaboration that allowed so many important individuals and organizations to reach out to the community and help stop the spread of HIV/AIDS.

Last year, the Consortium awarded \$6,000 in grants to four organizations in Delaware that provided funds for an emergency food closet, HIV/AIDS education, prevention workshops and conferences.

The Consortium also worked closely with AIDS Delaware and the Faith Community Partnership to host the 20th Annual Delaware AIDS Walk, which brought in more walkers, supporters and money than any other Walk. In October and November, the Ministry of Caring came aboard for the second year to sell more pies during our 'Easy As Pie' fund raiser.

"2006 was a perfect example of how much we can accomplish in Delaware to end the HIV/AIDS epidemic if we work together," Executive Director Peter Houle said.

This year will be another year of collaboration. The Consortium is already working with a handful of organizations and companies and will be working hard to raise more money to help even more Delawareans living with HIV/AIDS in the new year.

Spotlight on AIDS Delaware, Christiana Care HIV Program

This edition of Voices focuses on two of the oldest HIV/AIDS care providers in Delaware. Both Christiana Care and AIDS Delaware were established in the 1980's and continue to serve a large portion of men, women and children who are living with HIV/AIDS in the state. Both organizations have a state-wide presence, offering services in New Castle, Kent and Sussex Counties for easy accessibility.

Although AIDS Delaware and Christiana Care differ in the type of HIV/AIDS services they offer, each continues to be a major provider of services for Delaware residents and work hard in the communities they serve to halt the spread of HIV/AIDS.

AIDS Delaware



AIDS Delaware has long been recognized as a leader in HIV/AIDS case management, information, counseling, rapid testing and support throughout the state. With offices currently

located in Wilmington and Rehoboth Beach, AIDS Delaware has plans to expand into Georgetown and Kent County.

"Our goal is to offer services that are easily accessible to all Delawareans," Associate Director John Klein said.

Along with the services listed above, AIDS Delaware also offers weekly support groups, community education, statewide hot lines and fund raising events. They are the lead agency of the Delaware AIDS Walk (pictured above) and work with other organizations to organize the event.

Their next event will be held on February 10 and will recognize individuals involved in 'Do the Right Thing 4 Life,' a community effort to get HIV/AIDS information and protection to beauty shops and salons in New Castle County.

Christiana Care HIV Program

Established in October 1989, the HIV Program at Christiana Care remains the major care provider for clients living with HIV/AIDS throughout the state of Delaware. With six sites statewide, the program provides care to more than 1,400 individuals, which is about 65 percent of people living with HIV/AIDS in Delaware who access medical care.

"Our goal is to treat individuals living with HIV and AIDS, keep them out of the hospital and as healthy as possible," said Program Director Arlene Bincsik, adding that the annex also offers mental health counseling, case management, pregnancy mangement and care for Hepatitis C.

The staff of 50 includes board certified infectious disease physicians, pharmacists, social workers, secretaries and peer educators.

The Wilmington Annex is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and is located at 1400 Washington St.

Future of Christiana Care HIV Program's location unclear



Five years ago, Christiana Care bought the building at 1400 Washington St. to use as an annex to the hospital — a perfect location for their HIV program. Easy accessibility to the hospital (it's right across the street) and being located along a route for public transportation all helped the success of the HIV program and its patients.

There was a clause in the contract, however, that stated the city may buy back the building and the property within five years at fair market value if they decided to do so.

Fast forward five years, and the annex recently received notification that the city of Wilmington may exercise the right to buy back the building, meaning they may no longer have a place to house their HIV program.

"Moving the HIV program to anywhere else in Wilmington would be detrimental to the program's success," said Program Director Arlene Bincsik.

The City of Wilmington cites the location of the property, as well as the view of the Brandywine River, as reasons to develop a condominimum complex or town houses on the property.

"It's a beautiful piece of property," said William Montgomery, Mayor James M. Baker's chief of staff in the Jan. 10 issue of *The News Journal*. "It's got a \$1 million-plus view."

In the same article, Mr. Montgomery said that if the city were to purchase the property, they would ensure a smooth relocation for the clinic and make sure adequate plans would be made before the move.

That's not enough for the staff at the annex.

"There comes a point where people's needs must come before profit," Ms. Bincsik said. Christiana Care is committed to ensuring that the patients have easy access to the medical care they need.

According to the contract, the city has until the end of April to make a decision about developing the property.
