# Consortium recipient of MAC Cosmetics housing grant

The Delaware HIV Consortium recently received a housing grant in the amount of \$25,000 from the MAC Cosmetics MAC AIDS Fund.

The grant will help begin to "fill in the gaps" of the recent budget cuts, which total more than \$300,000 over the past couple of years. It will assist the program and allow it to continue to run at its status quo level, meaning it will keep the level of service that clients are currently receiving, but will not not be used to move clients off of the waiting list.

"We have lost so much HOPWA (Housing Opportunities for People Living with AIDS) funding, and housing is such a critical need in Delaware," said associate executive director Glen Pruitt, who wrote the grant. "This grant will go to help fill the funding shortfall so we can maintain clients in program. This kind of funding is critical."

Affordable housing for people living with HIV/AIDS has always been a top priority of the Delaware HIV Consortium. Since 1997, the Delaware HIV Consortium has administered the state's only rental assistance program specifically targeted for low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS. Our program provides more than 160 households per year the opportunity to live independently and affordably, and better manage their health issues.

The MAC AIDS Fund has been a major supporter of the Delaware HIV Consortium's annual WOW Awards Gala and has donated more than \$95 million globally since the fund was established in 1995.

#### La Red Health Center

Georgetown's La Red Health Center, a non-profit organization that provides quality, reliable and convenient health care for every stage of life to people living in and around Sussex County, recently celebrated a major achievement - the opening of its second facility.

"With an already limited number of physician practices in Sussex County, the increasing patient volume has served as the catalyst for us to expand our services," CEO Brian Olson said.

Originally a 1,400-square-foot building with three exam rooms, the facility has grown into a 2,800-square-foot building with six exam rooms.

The new facility, which is located directly across the street from the original center on Market Street in Georgetown, will allow more people to access their services, which include HIV prevention and outreach, comprehensive pediatric, adolescent, adult and geriatric primary care, childhood immunizations, diabetes education and prenatal care.

### **Kent/Sussex Counseling Services**

The Delaware HIV Consortium congratulates **Kent/Sussex Counseling Services (KSCS)** for their latest achievement - being awarded a three year accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

Robin Cubbage, the HIV/AIDS program manager at KSCS, explained that the accreditation means their HIV programs, which include case management, emergency client assistance and confidential HIV testing, meet internationally recognized standards. She explained that members of the commission interviewed clients and staff, researched records and reviewed all aspects of the HIV programs.

"This accreditation speaks volumes of the work we do here," she said. "It is a big achievement and shows dedication and commitment to the people we serve."

KSCS has offices in Dover, Georgetown and Laurel, and is considered to be one of the major "public" outpatient substance abuse treatment centers in Delaware's lower counties. In addition to the HIV services mentioned above, KSCS also offers education and counseling services to individuals diverted from the criminal justice system as well as substance abuse and mental health treatment.

CARF International is an independent, nonprofit accreditor of human service providers in the areas of aging services, behavioral health, child and youth services, employment and community services, and medical rehabilitation.

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

The most current statistics are always available on our Web site (www.delawarehiv.org). Under 'Consortium Library' click on 'statistics' and then 'surveillance reports.'

More than 3,300 people in Delaware are living with HIV/AIDS. 67.9 percent are male; 32.1 percent are female.

The majority of people living with HIV/AIDS reside in Wilmington. 2,349 people in Wilmington are infected, while 331 people in Kent County and 603 in Sussex County are living with the disease. (22 people are listed as 'unknown' regarding their county of residency.)

African Americans, both male and female, are becoming infected at an astronomical rate. 2,105 African Americans are infected, while 958 whites and 221 Hispanics are living with HIV/AIDS in Delaware.

One of the fastest growing age groups for HIV infection are young adults, ages 20-29.
